FPTA Supports:

- Reversing language that passed in HB 7031
 last session that made Capital Funding for
 the New Starts Transit program an ineligible
 expense previously funded by the doc stamp
 dollars that are transferred to the State
 Transportation Trust Fund, and restoring the
 changes made to the Transportation
 Regional Incentive Program and the Florida
 Rail Enterprise.
- A permanent increase to the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund.
- The creation of a Rural Transit Operating Trust Fund within the Florida Department of Transportation.
- A study that reviews the Medicaid Managed Care non-emergency transportation program to ensure the Medicaid brokers are operating a quality service and ensure the dollars are being spent appropriately.

FPTA will Ensure the Following is Held Harmless:

- Ensure the Public Transportation Block Grant remains fully funded.
- Ensure there are no negative changes to any tax laws, such as the Transportation Surtax or Charter County laws, that would negatively affect public transportation funding at the local level.
- Ensure that transportation funding intended for public transportation providers is not made available to outside providers that are not properly vetted.
- Ensure the state's obligation outlined in s. 343.58 for payments to the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority directly from the State Transportation Trust Fund for the total cost of operating and maintaining the South Florida Rail Corridor are maintained.
